PARALEGAL

The Paralegal course at Brunswick Community College is offered through the Division of Economic Workforce Development and Continuing Education. This course is approved by the North Carolina Bar Association and designed for working adults and retirees. Our Paralegal Certificate program provides practical skills, knowledge and application in the Paralegal career path. Student must complete at least 300 hours and maintain a GPA of at least the 80th percentile and pass the mid-term, final examination and Work Portfolio. No prerequisite, however an Associate's Degree is required to sit for the Certified Paralegal examination.

To Register Must Provide

- Original Driver's License, State Issued Identification Card, or Passport
- Social Security Card - must be signed and not laminated
- Names must match on ALL documents
- Official transcript provided within 60 days of enrolling
